This Sunday's Gospel Thoughts for the Week January 7, 2024



With Christ's help we can be his light for others.

. (Reading in Blue Missal: pg. 301)

1st Reading Is 60:1-6 Glory of God's Church

Returning in exile from Babylon, the Jews make a pilgrimage to Jerusalem. The poet envisages all nations joining this pilgrimage to the light. God manifesting himself in Jesus Christ is a light shining in the darkness of the human condition. The Gentiles responding to this revelation of God in Christ are symbolized by the Magi.

Responsorial Psalm: Lord, every nation on earth will adore you.

2nd Reading Eph 3: 2-3a, 5-6 Good News for All

Paul stresses that God manifested himself in the Lord Jesus not only to the Jews but to all nations. The Gentiles (non-Jews) are now coheirs with the Jews, members of Christ's body and sharers of the divine promise. "God has called you out of darkness, with his wonderful light: May you be strong in faith, hope and love".

Gospel Mt 2:2 Magi with Gifts

Yearning for self-determination, the Jews were constantly expecting a Messiah, freedom fighter, and redeemer from oppression. There was even a horoscope circulating, telling about his star, and we can readily understand that a superstitious Herod might be upset by Magi.

But rather than searching for the background material of this story we ask: Inspired by God, what does Matthew try to bring out by adding this legend to his Gospel, because that is God's word to you and me? Quoting scripture, Matthew teaches Jesus it the ruler who is to shepherd God's people. God's Epiphany (self-manifestation)

in Jesus Christ is for all! All should join mankind's search for the Light of the World!

What is the "Epiphany Blessing" and how is it given?

This special blessing asks for God's protection over our homes.

You may have seen it before over the doorway of a Catholic friend: 20+C+M+B+22 chalked on the lintel. This means that your friend's house has been blessed with a very special, very old custom. The custom echoes the Passover, wherein the Jewish people would sprinkle lamb's blood over their doorways as an invocation of God's blessing for their household. Blessed chalk is now used to mark the doorways for this Catholic blessing. It's a tradition that began in Eastern Europe. After Epiphany, the village priest went to every home in his parish with specially blessed Epiphany water and chalk. Upon entering the home, he prayed special prayers and blessed every room in the house. After this the numbers of the year, enclosing the initials of the Magi (Caspar, Melchior, and Balthasar) are written with the blessed chalk over the door. The Magi's initials also stand for a Latin house blessing: Christus mansionem benedicat (May Christ bless this house). Now that parishes have increased in size and priests are no longer able to visit every home, the head of the household is permitted to perform a basic Epiphany house blessing himself.
