The Eucharistic Miracles Exhibition

The Eucharistic Miracles of the World Exhibition will be on display at Maria Lanakila Parish, March 12-19, from 8:00am to 8:00pm daily. The Exhibit was designed and created by Blessed Carlo Acutis. He was born in 1991, died in 2006, and was beatified in 2020. At eleven, he began visiting sites of Eucharistic miracles with his parents. Blessed Carlos believed that if people knew that Jesus was truly present in the Eucharist, they would turn to God. Because of his intense love of the Blessed Sacrament, he used his computer skills to document Eucharistic miracles throughout the centuries. He spent four years on the project and by the age of fourteen, he had created the Eucharistic Miracles website and a display that would eventually tour the world.

This glorious exhibit consists of 156 panels depicting Vatican approved Eucharistic Miracles, saints associated with Eucharistic events, and Our Lady and the Eucharist. Most of the Eucharistic Miracles are instances when the consecrated Host physically changed into Jesus' Body and Blood. This will be a great opportunity to learn more about the real presence of Jesus in the Eucharist, deepen our faith, and grow closer to God.



How do we exercise good stewardship over the light of Christ that burns within each of us?

This Sunday's Gospel Thoughts for the Week February 5, 2023



1st Reading Is 58:7-10 Charity

The unknown prophet addresses Hebrews back from exile in Babylon. In their joy over newly found freedom, they have expected too much. God's people must seek something deeper and more genuine than just the experiences of being free. The writer goes into details of sharing, with the promise that "then...your wound shall quickly be healed."

Responsorial Psalm:

The just man is a light in darkness to the upright.

2nd Reading 1 Cor 2:1-5 Power of the Spirit

The Christian philosophy of life is defined as a sharing, especially of self, a sharing that hurts and can be a cross. This is a kind of "wisdom" that many do not accept.

Paul is aware that there are members in the congregation of Corinth who do not accept it either. Hence, he emphasizes that "faith rests not on human wisdom but on the power of God." We should pray for it constantly.

Gospel Mt 5:13-16 Light of the World

We are the new Israel and with our insight of faith we Christians are to be the "salt of the earth." But only by being dissolved in food does salt give it its taste. "You are the light of the world." Only by diffusing itself in the darkness does light enlighten.

Only by losing ourselves can we give "taste" to the life of deprived persons and enlighten their path when they falter.
