

PASTOR'S MESSAGE - Reflection on the ashes

After 100 years: all of us are buried, including our loved ones, our relatives, friends, and acquaintances. All our houses, buildings that we tried so hard to build will be occupied by different people. All that we have saved belongs to others; the cars we paid as installments will all be gone, or rusted, thrown away or buried as well. Again after 100 years all the jobs that we stress out for and worry about everyday are given to different people. The company we work for may not exist anymore. All the people we argue with, and those who make us angry, will disappear. All the assets and liabilities will no longer be ours. Our kids and grandkids will not remember or know us anymore. After our death, we become ashes or dust. Our pictures may appear in albums, be hung on the walls or appear on Facebook, but we will not be known anymore. Life is short and quick. But the shorter it becomes when we face it with fear, with worries, with panic and with doubt. All that exists has its end, and so, we should work for the things that will last; they are the things of the Lord.

It is important to know then that the Lord does not want us to waste our time with fear and weariness but to live it to the fullest. To make the most of our life here on earth. "If it doesn't matter in five years, then don't spend even 5 minutes on it. God cares for us, providing us all our needs. He also shows us the way to overcome the three great temptations on the things that will last only temporarily. Let us not give up or despair when faced with trials and tests. We cannot add to our life span by worrying. Mt. 12:25-31.

This Sunday's Gospel Thoughts for the Week February 18, 2024



Repent and believe in the gospel.

(Reading in Blue Missal: pg. 315)

Reading Gen 9: 8-15 Sign of the Covenant In order to understand the common theme of today's readings, we must keep in mind the belief of the ancients that disasters of nature, such as a flood, were caused by evil spirits, wicked angels, the power of evil and sin. But if people were faithful to God's covenant, they could overcome the power of evil with God's help. The flood story with its rainbow is a beautiful allegory containing a very meaningful and universal lesson. God will preserve the universe if human beings want to cooperate. Ecology is a Christian concern! Responsibly using the resources of the planet and not wasting them is overcoming the evil of destruction.

Responsorial Psalm: Your ways, O Lord, are love and truth, to those who keep your covenant.

2nd Reading 1 Pt 3: 18-22 Power of the Resurrection By his death Christ overcame the power of evil: "He... went to preach to the spirits in prison," announcing their defeat to the cosmic powers of evil, including the disobedient spirits at the time of Noah. This author sees an analogy between the waters of the flood and the baptismal bath. A few persons escaped in the ark through the water and were saved. A baptismal candidate goes through the water, is saved, and is able to overcome the powers of evil. The author warns, however, that the baptismal water as such does no good, unless it is accompanied by the pledge to God that proceeds from a good conscience.

Gospel Mk 1: 12-1! Time of Fulfillment

this passage, we read about the test, Satan, the wild beasts, and angels. Nothing has changed. All of this is still in and around us. The temptation to fall for warped values is perhaps even more powerful than it has ever been. Jesus gives the example of going into solitude. Making a retreat occasionally is very beneficial. Observing Lent can be done by all. Jesus is victorious over the powers of evil. Angels will wait on us, if only we ask God for help.




