

This Sunday's Gospel Thoughts for the Week March 3, 2024



Have zeal for the dwelling place of the Lord.

(Reading in Blue Missal: pg. 320)

Ex 20: 1-17 Reading Ten Commandments Since civil and religious laws were so intimately intertwined in Hebrew culture, we must read the laws of the Old Testament with this in mind. Civil laws and laws clearly conditioned by time and culture do not bind us any longer. The Ten Commandments, however, are timeless. Millions of Christians and Jews alike live by these laws. There is not only human but also divine wisdom embedded in them. But remember, in observing laws, we Christians should be motivated by love. "You did not receive a spirit of slavery to fall back into fear, but you received a spirit of adoption, through which we cry, Abba, "Father".

Responsorial Psalm: Lord, you have the words of everlasting life.

Reading 1 Cor 1:22-25 Christ, the Power of God Jews demand "signs". They want the spectacular. Greeks want "wisdom." Everything must be clearly understandable. There is no room for intuition, vision, mystery. It may be that Paul's Jews and Greeks characterize two kinds of Christians. The first comprises those who hanker for the spectacular in worship. It must be exciting, or they will not come. They are people who ask, "What does a worship service offer me?" and not, "What can I do to make it meaningful?" The second comprises the rationalists who crave wisdom, analysis, insight, but do not realize that values like mystery, intuition, love, or faith cannot be analyzed without being destroyed. Paul offers his vision to both groups, namely the cross, Christ crucified. What your stand?

Gospel John 2: 13-25 Prediction of the Resurrection In chapter 2, John relates the wedding at Cana as the first of Jesus' "signs." Then he relates the cleaning of the temple. Again "signs" are in the picture. "What sign can you show us?' Many began to believe ... when he saw the signs he was doing." John wants to teach that Jesus put an end to the old way of worship, and inaugurated a new worship "in spirit and truth". This transition was accomplished by Jesus' death and resurrection. A STEWARDSHIP MOMENT

3rd Sunday of Lent, Weekend of March 2 & 3

The If your parish celebrates the Mass for the First Scrutiny for catechumens preparing for Baptism at the Easter vigil, you may hear the Gospel story of Jesus speaking with the Samaritan woman at the well; someone who supposedly is of the wrong gender, wrong religion, and has lived the wrong life. The woman is overwhelmed by guilt and shame. And yet Jesus speaks to her and offers her "living waters" to quench her spiritual thirst. The living water that Jesus gives is new life through the Holy Spirit; a life that is accepted, forgiven, loved and eternal. Good stewards of their life in Christ remain mindful of their own spiritual thirst. They listen to Jesus who speaks to them just as he spoke with the Samaritan woman at the well. Jesus has living water for us today. He encourages us to come and drink. Are you thirsty? Are you ready to listen to him? If your parish does not celebrate the Mass for the First Scrutiny for catechumens, you may hear the Gospel story of Jesus' cleansing of the Temple, a familiar story. The prophets Jeremiah, Zechariah and Malachi prophesied that when the Kingdom of God was at hand, the Temple would be cleansed of all activities unworthy of an encounter with God. Christians are often referred to as "Temples of the Lord." As stewards of a "Holy Temple" God has entrusted to each one of us, what are we doing to be cleansed of activities unworthy of an encounter with the Lord? This week, reflect on one thing you can do to cleanse the Temple God has given you so that it becomes a more inviting home for Christ Jesus.
