# This Sunday's Gospel Thoughts for the Week March12, 2023



#### 1st Reading Ex 17:3-7 Water from Rock

"Is the Lord in our midst or not?" The authors of the Exodus traditions saw the wilderness period of their national history as a time to find security in God. Being thirsty, the Hebrews put God to a test. The water struck from the rock is the Biblical symbol for life, the life-giving presence of God. "Come... let us acclaim the Rock of our salvation. Let us come into his presence with thanksgiving."

#### **Responsorial Psalm:**

If today you hear his voice, harden not your hearts.

#### 2nd Reading Rom 5:1-2, 5-8 God's Love for Us

The life-giving presence of God and his love "poured out into our hearts through the Holy Spirit" are Christian realities. But the water of baptism was life-giving to you because Christ died for us godless people who were powerless through sin. This should not fail to inspire gratitude in us.

#### Gospel Jn 4:5-42, 19b-26, 39a, 40-42 Samaritan Woman

In this Gospel reading also, the symbol of water is used to describe God's life-giving presence. It is referred to as "the gift of God," "living water," "the water that will become ... a spring of water welling up to eternal life. "Only God in our midst can ultimately saturate all our desires! The Samaritan woman stands for all of us.

We should cultivate our understanding of Biblical symbols. You were baptized with water. It gave you life everlasting. Making the sign of the

cross with holy when water vou enter church for worship is a reminder of your baptism. Make this symbolism meaningful!
