

This Sunday's Gospel Thoughts for the Week March 25, 2023



1st Reading Ez 37:12-14 The Lord's Promise

Using the language of vision (i.e. the famous vision of the "dry bones"), Ezekiel sees the Jews in exile to be as dead as the bones of dead men scattered on a battlefield. The Lord brings these bones back to life, and breathes a new spirit into them and resettles them upon their own land. The prophet refers to the exiles' return to their home country, where they will start a new life.

Reapplied to use today, the message, God's word, is: A Christian who is indifferent and/or disappointed by Church life, confused about changes, a person about to give up, is like those dry bones. God promises: "I will put my spirit in you that you may live." A Christian believes this and can pray: "With the Lord there is mercy and fullness of redemption."

Responsorial Psalm:

With the Lord there is mercy and fullness of redemption.

2nd Reading Rom 8:8-11 Indwelling of Christ's Spirit

Guided by God, Paul states that those who are "in the flesh," that is, those who look at life solely from the viewpoint of the flesh, get nowhere. But as baptized Christian you are not "in the flesh;' at least you should not be. If you act as if you are still "in the flesh," you are not your real self. You have not sufficiently died to your old self. The Spirit dwells in you. Let him animate you.

The main point is that as a Christian you should respond to this internal power in you. Only then will you really be alive. Note that Paul uses "Spirit of God," "Spirit of Christ," "Spirit," and even "Christ" interchangeably. In each case the point is the divine indwelling seen as a principle of life.

Gospel Jn 11:1-45 Lazarus

John relates Jesus' miracles as "signs," earthly realities that indicate a full reality to come. Inspired by God, what does John wish to indicate by relating this miracle of Jesus? We notice that the evangelist places the Lazarus story just before the passion narrative. Significantly, he remarks: "From that day on they planned to kill (Jesus).

This passage teaches: Jesus, calling himself the resurrection and the life, will die to inaugurate the resurrection of human beings. "Just as the Father raises the dead and gives life, so also does the Son give life to whomever he wishes". John suggests that you should put your faith in Jesus as many Jews did when they witnessed the raising of Lazarus.



English Translation - May 2, 2022

Decree for the erection of a way of the cross at Our Lady of Queen of the Angel's Church, Keokea, Maui.

In virtue of the faculty given to me, I, James J. Sweeney grant the authorization to build a way of the cross with the appropriate indulgences that come with erection of a way of the cross in keeping with

The statutes of sacred congregation dated 10th May, 1742. As testimony to the above I have affixed my signature to this document on the 3rd of May 1943. Signed by: James J. Sweeney, Bishop of Honolulu
