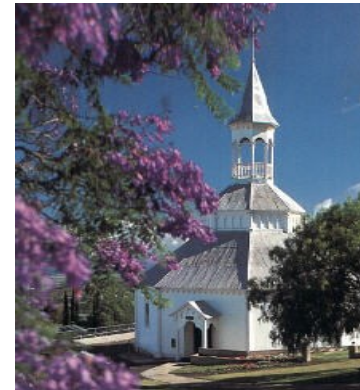

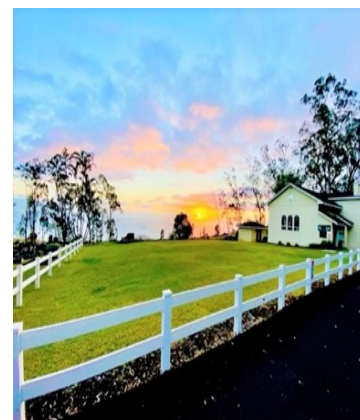

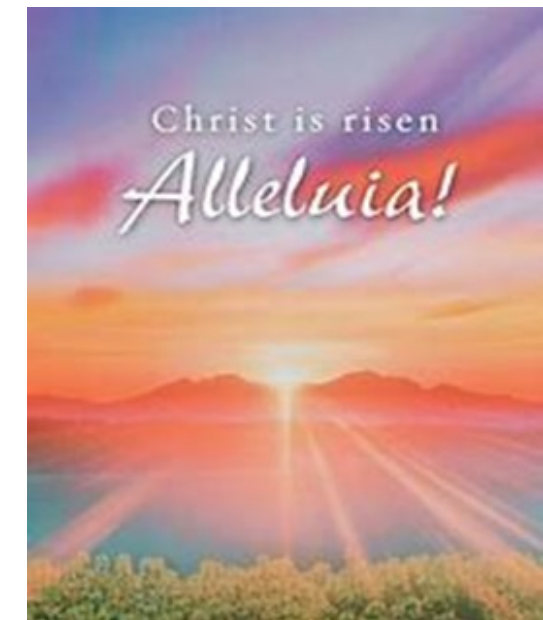

**This Sunday's Gospel**  
**Thoughts for the Week**  
**March 31, 2024**



*Yes, Christ my hope is arisen; to Galilee he goes before you.*

*(Reading in Blue Missal: Easter Vigil pg.699; Easter Sunday pg. 740.)*

**1st Reading Acts 10:34a, 37-43**  
**Salvation in Christ**

In this speech of Peter, Luke wants to bring out the basic message of the early church: the Lord's rejection ("they put him to death"); God's vindication ("God raised him"); and the apostles' witness to the Christ-event ("he commissioned us to preach"). Referring to the stone rejected and made the headstone of the corner, the Church applies Psalm 118 to the death and resurrection of Christ.

**Responsorial Psalm:**

This is the day the Lord has made, let us rejoice and be glad.

**2nd Reading Col 3: 1-4**  
**Seek Heavenly Things**

The first reading proclaims the living Christ, his life, death, and resurrection. This Second Reading tells us about the implications of all of this for us. Through baptism you have died to your own sinful and egotistic self and you have been raised up to a new life with Christ. You are a Christian. This life is hidden. In its fullness, it will appear in the life to come. The lesson is: "Think of what is above, not of what is on earth." This is a strong Semitic saying with the obvious meaning: Do not be so captivated by the tinsel or so infected with the commercialism of the day that you lose sight of the things above!

**Gospel John 20: 1-9 Renewed Faith**

The point (God's Word) seems to be: "He saw and believed." The disciples were slow in coming to a realization of the resurrection since the Holy Spirit had not yet come to enlighten the Church concerning all these divine mysteries. We need the Holy Spirit! "God our Father .... Let our celebration today raise us up and renew our lives by the Spirit that is within us."

**What is the National Eucharistic Revival?**

The National Eucharistic Revival is a three-year initiative sponsored by the Bishops of the United States to inspire and prepare the People of God to be formed, healed, converted, united, and sent out to a hurting and hungry world through a renewed encounter with Jesus in the Eucharist – the source and summit of our Catholic faith. The Revival officially launched in June 2022, and its milestone event will be a National Eucharistic Congress in Indianapolis, IN, from July 17-21, 2024. The National Eucharistic Revival and National Eucharistic Congress are a direct response to the Holy Father's call for a "pastoral and missionary conversion which cannot leave things as they presently are" so that the Church in the United States might be "permanently in a state of mission" (Evangelii Gaudium, n. 25).

This eucharistic movement seeks to bring together clergy, religious, laity, apostolates, movements, and parish and diocesan leaders to spur momentum, collaboration, and lasting impact for the renewal of the Catholic Church in the U.S. over the next three years.

**Maui Vicariate Eucharistic Revival Shirt**  
**"Hō'eu'eu Eukalikia"**

In the Hawaiian language, "Hō'eu'eu" means "to rouse" or "to stir up," and "Eukalikia" is a term referring to the Eucharist, the Christian sacrament of communion. Together, the phrase "Hō'eu'eu Eukalika" can be translated as "To stir up the Eucharist."

In the context of our Hawaii diocesan Eucharistic revival, this phrase serves as a powerful reminder to reawaken our appreciation, understanding, and active participation in the Eucharist. It calls on us to deepen our connection with this sacred sacrament and to share its significance with others."
