

We have a chance to practice hospitality by inviting Jesus into our hearts to walk and talk with us about our own Emmaus journey. We can relive once again the time when he broke bread for the disciples. And just as they did, we too can recognize Christ in this meal we have just shared with others.

This Sunday's Gospel Thoughts for the Week April 23, 2023



1st Reading Acts 2:14, 22-33 Reform Your Lives

This passage is the first of six major sermons in Acts. All of these six sermons deal with the substance of the Christian message. It is: "Dying you destroyed our death, rising you restored our life. Lord Jesus, come in glory".

Peter's citation from Psalm 16 illustrates the freedom with which the early Church made use of the Hebrew Bible. The Psalm describes God as saving his chosen ones from destruction. Peter applies this to God's chosen one par excellence, Jesus Christ, and brings out his point: God raised up Jesus from the dead according to his "set plan and foreknowledge."

Responsorial Psalm:

Lord, you will show us the path of life.

2nd Reading 1 Peter 1:17-21 Conduct Yourselves Reverently

The writer describes Christ's death and its salutary effect on us in terms of the Jewish Passover: sojourn in a strange land and deliverance by the blood of a spotless Passover lamb. We are still in a strange land, but we are delivered by Christ our Passover Sacrifice. For final deliverance from pain and evil, we have "faith and hope...in God."

Gospel Lk 24:13-35 Christ is Lord

This story is one of the most beautifully written by Luke and it offers a wealth of theological (religious) insight. God's words should be "burning within" us as often as we meditatively read it at home and listen to it in church. Meeting the Lord Jesus in the breaking of bread (the Eucharistic Celebration) should open our eyes ever more! "Lord Jesus, open the Scriptures to us; make our hearts burn while you speak to us".

PASTOR'S CORNER

My Dear Brothers and Sisters/ Parishioners / Cosojourners as Kula Catholic Community,

3rd Sunday of Easter Year A: The Lord is close to the broken hearted. Ps. 34:18. The gospel relates to us the situation of the travelers from Jerusalem to Emmaus; how broken hearted they were as they stopped, looking downcast. Lk. 24:17

I could see that it is so hard for us to do away with the "throwaway culture." God made all things in six days, the rest all made in China? We buy things and use them only once or twice and then they end up in the dumpsite. The same thing goes with foods and drinks, we keep them inside the refrigerator, only to let them expire and so be thrown in the end. The medicines too; the first thing to do is check the expiration dates. And there are so many expired medicines, including vaccines being wasted. We also throw away things because they are old, outdated or broken as it is more expensive to fix than to buy a new one. In short, we waste our money in the wrong way.

God created us and He saves us. His love for us never expires. He never gives up on us but fixes the broken hearted and lifts the fallen. He still trusts us despite the wrong path we have taken in the past. There is no need of a trash bin nor shred machines for God. He is never too far to grab and rush to hug even though we might want to hide in the dark, because even darkness is not dark to Him. Ps. 139:12. So, let Him be a part of us to choose the right path, in the midst of sorrows and tests, bitterness and distress that could block our vision and hinder us from seeing and recognizing Him.
