## 1st Reading Acts 8:5-8, 14-17 Reception of Holy Spirit

We read about the success of the disciples witnessing to the Lord Jesus. Their words and signs bring people of all walks of life, even "the despised Samaritans," to faith in the risen Lord Jesus. By imposing hands on them, the apostles receive them into the Christian fellowship whose headquarters are still in Jerusalem at this time.

Let all the earth cry out to God with joy.


#### 2nd Reading 1 Peter 4:13-16 Joy in Suffering

Peter reminds Christians who have to suffer that they can be happy nevertheless, "for then God's Spirit in its glory has come to rest on you." If you suffer for being a Christian, do not be ashamed! Pray that God's Spirit may give all of us this insight!

#### Gospel Jn 17:1-11a Eternal Life

Today's Gospel is taken from Jesus' high priestly prayer, also called "prayer of consecration," because Jesus consecrates himself for his approaching redemptive death. Actually, this prayer reflects an elaborated meditation on the thoughts and aspirations of our Lord. Jesus begins his passion with prayer. Our Lord meditates on what he has to do. He recommends his disciples to his Father. He has made them know the Father. Now they must go out into the world and, filled with Jesus' Spirit. Teach all nations.

The task of a Christian in the world is not an easy one. As the Lord prayed in the difficult hours of his life, we should do the same, especially during this week of prayerful preparation for Pentecost.


