

A Stewardship Moment: In today's second reading Saint Paul's final appeal is a call for unity. God created that unity. Good stewards who share Christ's life in the Eucharist belong to each other, just as God in the three persons of Father, Son and Holy Spirit enjoy unity. We are an intimate part of God's divine bond, God's "family." Saint Paul maintains that we ought to act that way. In the Church there is a bond of family, yet plenty of room for variety. Christian stewards use their uniquely varied gifts to live a Trinitarian faith, in unity, promoting Christ's peace and justice. How do we promote unity in our parish?

# This Sunday's Gospel Thoughts for the Week June 4, 2023



#### 1st Reading Ex 34:4b-6,8-9 The One God

The content of this reading concerns the infidelity of God's people at Sinai. They have made a golden calf to worship. Moses, coming down from the mountain, sees the infidelity, becomes angered, breaks the tablets of the law and destroys the calf. But Moses goes back to God, who appears to him again. Note how the author ascribes human characteristics to God, as is done often in the Bible (the eye of God, his punishing hand, his anger, etc.). Humans try to say something about God! Note also the cloud, a favored image (symbol) of God's presence.

The Old Testament does not reveal the Blessed Trinity. In retrospect we see some indications: God in himself—shares himself—creates a response in the heart of Moses. Our response: Bowing down in worship, as Moses did!

#### 2nd Reading 1 Cor 13:11-13 God's Grace, Love, and Fidelity

In this reading we have Paul's fervent wish for the congregation in Corinth, Greece. He mentions the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit, God related to us and our salvation. "The grace of the Lord Jesus Christ [which he acquired for us by his death and resurrection] and the love of God [the Father, the origin of our salvation] and the fellowship of the Holy Spirit [keeping us together] be with all of you."

#### Gospel Jn 3:16-18 God's Love

"God so loved the world [us] that he gave his only Son [Word: a word is our brainchild!]." God, not far away, but closely present (First Reading), wants to be present to you. He wants to communicate with you. The condition is that you open up to him, for communication is a two-way street! You can do so since God has given you the Spirit of his Son to form your heart and make you cry out: Abba, Father!
