



A STEWARDSHIP MOMENT

In today's gospel reading the Twelve hear Jesus speak these words: "Whoever does not take up his cross and follow after me is not worthy of me." This is the first time Matthew mentions the word "cross" in his gospel, and it is not in direct reference to Jesus' crucifixion but as a prerequisite to following him. Good stewards recognize that the call to discipleship requires them to "take up the cross" and align their goals in life and their fate with that of Jesus, that is, with suffering, opposition, resistance and even death. Reflect this week on the crosses you need to take up daily in order to comprehend the way of Jesus Christ.

This Sunday's Gospel Thoughts for the Week July 2, 2023



1st Reading 2 Kgs 4:8-11, 14-16a Rewards of Hospitality

This reading stresses the reason why the woman received Elisha into her house: "I know that he is a holy man of God," a preacher, which means in the Bible "a bearer of God's word." Christians should accept their priests as such, especially when listening to the Sunday sermon. They should also keep in mind that the priest has to gear his sermon to all levels of the congregation. When you do not get enough out of the sermon, you could do some additional reading at home.

Responsorial Psalm:

Forever I will sing the goodness of the Lord.

2nd Reading Rom 6:3-4, 8-11 Baptized into Christ

In this passage, notice that references to our dying with Christ in baptism (best symbolized by baptism of immersion) are all in the past tense. No matter how much a Christian fails, baptism cannot be undone. References to our resurrection with Christ, however, are future. Our new life with Christ must constantly grow, and working on it is a lifetime job.

Gospel Mt 10:37-42 Welcoming Christ's Workers

Like the last two Sundays, this reading from Matthew's Gospel also deals with our Lord's missionary charge to his apostles. The first part brings out that Jesus requires total dedication to their calling. The second part tells how the Lord Jesus expects his envoys to be accepted. As in the First Reading, the emphasis is on the motive why we should accept the prophet (a man who speaks for God), the holy man (the bearer of God's word).

<u>REFLECTION</u>: We are called to carry our cross and follow Jesus.

The readings today reflect on what we gain through sacrifice. Sacrifice is not just about what we give up, but rather what we discern to be unnecessary or in vain. When we put these things aside, we then can find what is most important. Jesus teaches us that through sacrifice, we find our true reward with him.
