The Holy Spirit intercedes and prays for us even if we can't come up with appropriate words; even when we don't have a clue what to ask for. We are not left alone. Good stewards know that prayer is an important part of living a life in Christ. The important thing is to make space for God. Do we let God into our hearts? Do we make room for the Holy Spirit to pray within us?

This Sunday's Gospel Thoughts for the Week July 23, 2023



Reading in Blue Missal: pg. 219

1st Reading Wis 12:13, 16-19 God's Mercy

This reading, emphasizing the notion of God's forbearance, provides an introduction for the parable of the weeds in the Gospel. "Though you [God] are master of might, you judge with clemency...And you taught your people, by these deeds, that those who are just must be kind." Can you honestly pray: "You, O Lord, are good and forgiving" (Responsorial Psalm); "forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive those who trespass against us"?

Responsorial Psalm: Lord, you are good and forgiving.

2nd Reading Rom 8:26-27 Intercession of the Spirit

Weak and inclined to evil as people are, in prayer they should turn to the Spirit. We do not even know how to express ourselves in prayer. The Spirit must translate our inarticulate desires. For we have the Spirit dwelling in us through our baptism (Rom 5:5; Jn 3:5-6), and it is he who assists us in formulating that just prayer which is according to God's saving plan and has our salvation as its object.

Gospel Mt 13:24-43 or 13:24-30 Parable of the Weeds

This parable of the weeds, its allegorical explanation, the remark on teaching in parables, and two other little parables (on the mustard seed and the yeast) require the same approach as the parable of the sower of last Sunday. The Shorter Form gives just the parable, which may be closest to the form in which Jesus spoke it. The allegorical explanation at the end has been added later. The remark on teaching in parables is also a later insertion. And in the final redaction of Matthew's text, somehow the two little parables on the mustard seed and the yeast ended up in between! Since the first reading on God's forbearance sets the tone, we concentrate on the parable of the weeds and its explanation. We should be patient with our failing fellow humans!

<u>FOCUS</u>: Jesus encourages us to persevere in faith even in challenging circumstances.

In our daily lives, it can be challenging to persevere in faith, in charity, and in kindness when dealing with people who appear to be the opposite – mean, vengeful, thoughtless. But Jesus reminds us that it is still possible to bear fruit under these conditions, and that even a small seed of faith can yield abundant fruit.
