A STEWARDSHIP MOMENT: Today we celebrate the Feast of the Transfiguration of the Lord, and in today's Gospel reading we hear it proclaimed that on Mount Tabor, Peter, James, and John caught a glimpse of Jesus' divinity strong enough to strike fear into their hearts. The event took place shortly after Peter's confession of faith that Jesus was, indeed, the Messiah. In today's second reading from Peter, we hear his personal testimony. This comes from a man who spent more than three years with Jesus. Peter witnessed his humanity. He saw Jesus hungry, tired, and finally, rejected and crucified. But he also saw Jesus feed the 5,000, walk on water, heal the sick, and raise the dead. He saw Jesus in his glory when he was transfigured. He saw Jesus risen from the dead and ascend into heaven with the promise that he is coming again in power and glory. How strong is the stewardship of our own faith? Do we accept Peter's apostolic witness to Jesus as Christ? Does this testimony help us acknowledge and trust Christ Jesus as our Lord and savior?

This Sunday's Gospel Thoughts for the Week August 6, 2023



Reading in Blue Missal: pg. 769

1st Reading Dn 7:9-10, 13-14 **Clothing White As Snow**

The author wants to console his fellow faithful who are being persecuted for their faith by King Antiochus Epiphanes. "The Ancient One" is God, and the "Son of man" is the Messianic King, applied to Jesus Christ.

We should read this passage and also the Responsorial Psalm against the background of our Lord's transfiguration, as described in the Gospel.

Responsorial Psalm:

The Lord is king, the most high over all the earth.

2nd Reading 2 Pt 1:16-29 Peter, an Evewitness

The author teaches about the exalted Lord Jesus Christ. For those who might refuse to believe in Jesus' second coming, he refers to the transfiguration, as witnessed by the apostles. In other words, the author states that Jesus has already the essential qualities that will be revealed when he comes again. At the end, the writer explains what meditating on the exalted Christ should mean for us, namely, a renewed awareness of our own exaltation to come.

Gospel Mt 17:1-9 Face Like the Sun

In the transfiguration, we are invited to see the Lord Jesus as he really is. He is the king of creation. And in the exalted Christ, we see ourselves as we will be when our time comes. This faith awareness should encourage us when we are going through a time of depression and darkness.

FOCUS: The Father instructs us to *listen*, and the Son encourages us, do not be afraid.

On the mountaintop we hear two direct commands: Listen to him and Do not be afraid. Think of what we might be afraid of. Maybe following Jesus will change us. Perhaps God's call will mean facing things that are unpleasant. We may even be afraid that decisions made on the mountaintop with Christ will be hard to live out in normal life. Listen to the Lord, and fear not - trust in the power of God.


