



The Exaltation of the Cross - 9/14, Stations of the Cross, 5:30pm, Mass at 6pm, OLQA

The feast of the Exaltation of the Holy Cross celebrates two historical events: the discovery of the True Cross by Saint Helena, the mother of the Emperor Constantine, in 320 under the temple of Venus in Jerusalem, and the

dedication in 335 of the basilica and shrine built on Calvary by Constantine, which mark the site of the Crucifixion.

The basilica, named the Martyrium, and the shrine, named the Calvarium, were destroyed by the Persians in 614. The Church of the Holy sepulcher which now stands on the site was built by the crusaders in 1149.

However the feast, more than anything else, is a celebration and commemoration of God's greatest work: his salvific death on the Cross and His Resurrection, through which death was defeated and the doors to Heaven opened.

This Sunday's Gospel Thoughts for the Week September 10, 2023



Jesus is present when we gather together and love one another. (Reading in Blue Missal: pg. 236)

1st Reading Ez 33:7-9 Warning the Wicked

Watchmen on the city walls or out on the hills formed part of the defense system in Biblical times. They had to sound a warning when undesired foreigners were spotted. Ezekiel sees the prophet, God's "mouthpiece", as such a watchman, in charge of the well-being of the community. He must do his duty. The message seems to be that we must be willing to accept correction first of all from those in charge of the community: children from parents; parishioners from priests; students from teachers; employees from employer; citizens from the law enforcer. Those who are not willing to accept fair and respectfully given correction are in a weak position when they have to correct others.

Responsorial Psalm:

If today you hear his voice, harden not your hearts

2nd Reading Rom 13: 8-10

As Jesus did, Paul quotes the Old Testament and sees love as the unifying principle behind all laws and commandments. "Love does no evil to the neighbor," even though an honest and respectful fraternal correction may cause some necessary pain.

Gospel Mt 18: 15-20 Communal Correction and Prayer

As we have this tradition in Matthew, it brings out that fraternal correction is the concern not only of "the watchman", but of all "the brethren." Genuine love for others implies the willingness to correct them, if necessary, and to accept correction from them as well!

Fraternal correction given with due respect and inspired by love is a favor for which we should be grateful, even if it hurts our pride. In strong language we are told that the well-being of the community should prevail over the questionable well-being of an individual if there is no other way.
