(Reading in Blue Missal: pg. 250)

1st Reading Is 25: 6-10 God as Savior

Eating or "breaking bread" with a person is a Biblical sign of intimate friendship. Isaiah locates the banquet of the end-time (the time of God's kingdom on earth) on Zion, the holy mountain of the Lord in Jerusalem. God will take away the veil that keeps us from seeing him. He will open the eyes of the faith and we will recognize him as "our God." "Behold our God, to whom we looked to save us. This is the Lord for whom we looked."

Responsorial Psalm: I shall live in the house of the Lord all the days of my life.

2nd Reading Phil 4: 12-14, 19-20 Sharing in Hardships

Paul in prison had received a gift of money from the congregation of Philippi. He is grateful and appreciative. "It was kind of you to share in my distress." And God will reward you: "My God will fully supply whatever you need." God's message to us could be: Be concerned and help, when you know a fellow human enduring hardship.

Gospel Mt 22: 1-14 The Wedding Banquet

Why does the king cast out a guest for not being properly dressed for the occasion when the guests are "whomever you find" on the byroads? Maybe the poor fellow came from his field where he had been working all the day! This passage consists of two parable. The second on the wedding garment as such, the message is clear: When you accept the invitation to God's banquet (the Holy Eucharist- God's companionship in heaven) you are supposed to be clean. The first parable God's word to us may be: God invites you. Appreciate the invitation and join the banquet!

UPDATE: This fund is to provide financial assistance to those who have lost their job or lost property in the August 8 Maui fires and need help paying bills for utilities, rent, mortgage, insurance, etc. up to maximum \$500 per household. Applicants must present a valid ID and a copy of the utility or accepted bill to be paid. Vendors will be paid directly. Funds are made possible by Father Kens Vineyard.
