

A STEWARDSHIP MOMENT

In today's Gospel Jesus lays judgment on the scribes and Pharisees for the hypocritical way they lived out their faith. The criticisms he levies are all about the ways righteousness turns into selfrighteousness, and how religious belief could turn into something that was more about elevating themselves than about what they could do for God or their neighbor. Good stewards know that discipleship means finding ways to serve, and searching for ways to be a servant—to live as a servant of Christ. When faith is authentically lived out in community everyone is enriched, and God is glorified. Reflect this week on how you live out your faith.

This Sunday's Gospel Thoughts for the Week November 5, 2023



Whoever humbles himself will be exalted. (Reading in Blue Missal: pg. 257)

1st Reading Mal 1: 14b-2:2b, 8-10 Violating the Covenant

The author of this prophetic book is unknown. The book's title "Malachi" is taken from 3:1 and means "my messenger." The work was written after the return of the exiles from Babylon. During that time of reconstruction, public worship in the Jerusalem temple was in a bad state. Figuratively, the prophet lets God address the priests, who in particular neglected their duty of teaching the Torah: "You priests have caused many to falter by your instruction... you do not keep my ways." What could possibly be the message to those who are not priests? Perhaps that we should pray for good leadership in our Church.

Responsorial Psalm: In you, Lord, I have found peace

2nd Reading 1 Thes 2: 7b-9, 13 God's Good Tidings

Today's First Reading and Gospel are critical of priests. This passage tells us how Christians should look at their priests with the eyes of faith. Not all priests are as gentle, great, saintly, and dedicated as Paul was. Whether a priest's sermon be good or bad, we should receive the message not as the word of humans, but as the Word of God.

Gospel Mt 32: 1-12The Virtue of Humility

After the destruction of Jerusalem, a bitter hostility had developed between Judaism and Palestinian Christianity. Indeed, Jesus had opposed the legalism of the Pharisees, but Matthew, himself involved in the struggle between his Church and the Jewish rabbis, magnifies out of all proportion an element that was present in Jesus' teaching. This shows the human factor already at work in the early Church. Priests should heed the lesson. They are rabbis (teachers) and fathers only in relation to God (Jesus does not dictate a vocabulary; he demands the right Spirit!). And God's people could heed the message as explained in the Theme.
