




PASTOR'S MESSAGE

This Sunday's Gospel Thoughts for the Week November 12, 2023



Always be prepared to welcome Christ, for we know neither the day nor the hour of his arrival. (Reading in Blue Missal: pg. 260)

1st Reading Wis 6: 12-16 Love of Wisdom

The book of Wisdom, the latest of the Old Testament Books, was written in Greek by a believing Jew living in Alexandria, Egypt. In it, Wisdom is personified, a literary device used often in all literatures of the world. Wisdom, which incorporated that mysterious dimension called faith, is a gift of God. "She (Wisdom) makes her own rounds, seeking those worthy of her." This God-given wisdom is resplendent and unfading! We should be grateful for it.

Responsorial Psalm: My soul is thirsting for you, O Lord my God.

2nd Reading 1 Thes 4: 13-18 Rising from the Dead

As already mentioned, Paul wrote this letter to his newly founded congregation in Thessalonica. Timothy had brought him a good report concerning the behavior of these new converts. However, they had a few questions, one about death and the return of Jesus. This passage give the Christian's answer, which is inspired not by human wisdom alone, but by a human-divine wisdom that we call Faith.

Gospel Mt 25:1-13 The Need for Watchfulness

Today's Gospel has the same message as found in the Second Reading, but now in the form of a parable. As we have this parable revised and edited by Matthew, it deals with two classes of people: the foolish ones who were not ready, and those who had wisdom and were ready when the groom (Jesus) arrived. Always be prepared to meet the Lord!
