

A STEWARDSHIP MOMENT The Gospel story of Jesus' encounter with Zacchaeus makes for an ideal stewardship reflection. So does today's first reading from the Book of Wisdom. Good stewards have faith in, and give thanks for, an almighty and powerful God who transcends the universe, but who gives personal attention to every human being. God loves his creation, his people. He lives in them, and through his Holy Spirit, instills a fundamental goodness in them. Good stewards recognize this movement of the Spirit as a gift and make efforts to cultivate this gift and grow in their faith. Take time this week to stop and look around you, be aware of God's awe-inspiring creation, and give thanks for God's loving care and concern for each of us.

This Sunday's Gospel Thoughts for the Week October 30, 2022



1st Reading Wis 11:22-12:2 Imperishable Spirit

God's loving care manifests itself in the preservation of all things and in the forgiveness of sin. "But you spare all things, because they are yours, O Lord and lover of souls." God's business of maintaining the universe is larger than that of any of the multinational corporations, yet more human!

This passage prepares us for the Gospel reading, where God, appearing in Jesus Christ, shows his loving care for the outcast Zacchaeus. "The Lord lifts up all who are falling and raises up all who are bowed down".

Responsorial Psalm:

I will praise your name forever my king and my God.

2nd Reading 2 Thes 1:11-2:2 The Day of the Lord

Because of rumors, the congregation of Thessalonica thought that the second coming of Christ was imminent. Paul tells the faithful not to be so easily agitated, but to be worthy of God's call and do their work!

We pray that God will make us worthy of our call. The name of the Lord Jesus must be glorified in us. We must be like him who showed patience and mercy (Gospel).

Gospel Lk 19:1-10 Salvation

The tax collectors were the quislings of Jesus' society. They collaborated with the Roman occupation forces by collecting the taxes for them. Tax collectors were hated and shunned by genuine Jews and regarded as "sinners." Zacchaeus' goodwill is clear. But Jesus takes the initiative. He shows concern for this apparent "failure" in his society. How do we handle "failures" in our community? Do we exhaust all means to help them?

<u>Universal Prayer</u>: Receive the Lord who comes to us in the Eucharist with joy and be ready for change. For Zacchaeus received Jesus and was changed by the encounter. We, too, are meant to be transformed, for the sake of the world.


