

Veteran's Day Prayer

Lord God, Almighty Father, creator of mankind and author of peace, as we are ever mindful of the cost paid for the liberty we possess, we ask you to bless the members of our armed forces. A STEWARDSHIP MOMENT In today's second reading we hear Saint Paul urging the members of the community at Thessalonica to direct their hearts to God's love through Christ. He wants them to be laser-focused on Christ, and nothing else. He desires that they be strengthened by the Lord and shielded from what is not Christ-like. Good stewards cultivate a "laser-sharp" focus on Christ; not on things that could give them false or superficial images or ideals. Let us think about our own daily focus: Do we direct out hearts toward Christ or are there other "gods" that claim our attention? Our career? Material possessions? Sexuality? Favorite sports team? Political leanings? Does our daily life point to Christ so that those who are younger and less mature in their faith learn from our example?

<u>This Sunday's Gospel</u> <u>Thoughts for the Week</u> November 6, 2022



1st Reading 2 Mc 7:1-2, 9-14 Martyrdom

The First and Second Books of Maccabees relate the persecution of Antiochus Epiphanes, the Syrian ruler of Palestine who tried to impose Greek culture and religion on all subjects of his empire. The orthodox Jews resisted violently. The First Book of Maccabees relates the Jewish revolt. The Second Book offers theological reflections on all that had happened. It has a timeless message for all who suffer for God's sake. Note the element of hope in the tragedy of the martyrs in this passage: "It is my choice to die at the hands of men with the hope God gives of being raised up by him.": What about your fidelity to the vows of your baptism?

Responsorial Psalm: Lord, when your glory appears, my joy will be full.

2nd Reading 2 Thes 2:16-3:5 Consolation and Strength

One of the beautiful elements in the Christian faith is hope for a better future, if not in this life then in the hereafter (First Reading and Gospel). In this passage, Paul first offers a prayer for the young church of Thessalonica: that it be given hope and strength. Then he requires the congregation to pray for him. Finally, he prays for them again, that God may bestow love and constancy. Pastor and congregation should pray for one another. We all need hope, strength, love, and constancy.

Gospel Lk 20:27-38 or 20:27, 34-38 Alive for God

"Moses wrote for us...": the Sadducees refer to Deuteronomy 25:5-10, the law of the "Levirate" marriage. The reasons for this law were to provide for the widow, the family name, and the inheritance. But Jesus' opponents are not interested in the legality of this law as such; they want to ridicule Jesus' teaching concerning the resurrection and life everlasting. Jesus shows himself master of the situation. Those in the hereafter do not marry because they are no longer liable to death. The Sadducees did not believe in the resurrection because they could not find anything about it in the Books of Moses. That is why Jesus refers to Exodus (3:6) which was one of the Books of Moses. The God of the living cares also for you.

PASTOR'S CORNER

We believe in the Communion of Saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body and life everlasting! We have just celebrated the Solemnity of all Saints, followed by All Souls' Day. It means, we celebrated what we professed. We celebrate our future because all of us are going through the process. Christ had emphasized resurrection of the bodied in today's Gospel.

Since I have come to this parish on January 10, 2020, there were about twenty from the Kula Catholic Community had gone ahead of us to the next life. Good thing, we believe that they are very much a part of us in the communion of saints. So far, I baptized two babies to be the new members to this Church. Among the rest of our members, a few members had gone to other parishes, moved to other states and some never came back to Church since the Pandemic had devastated us. Still, some might have gone astray on their ways, making their own gods. In fact, many of our community members are the seniors and in a few years the number will be dwindling and so the young ought to join in and take the lead as we cannot just rely on the tourists. At present, we do not have enough personnel in the parish's different ministries.

I do believe that a healthy parish is a wholistic one: with healthy people of God both in quantity and quality then it can render faithful service to the Lord both spiritual and corporal obligations. It can also move from Maintaining Church to a "Mission" church to reach out to more people, who are in need; the sick, the lonely, the lost and the last and those who never know God. "God desires all men to be saved." CCC #74. In fact, "Catholic" means "Universal" and it is for all.CCC#830. Christ instituted this Church for the Salvation of souls.

At present, we are trying some new things such as the youth gatherings and praying the Rosary at private homes in the month of October and healing masses every first Wednesday of the month etc. Last week Saturday, we gathered and put together some ideas and suggestions implementable for our community to help us grow together in number and in size. Therefore, if we understand that God saves souls through this Church, we must work hard to increase its numbers with sound teachings from the Lord. We should use any means to transfer the Word of God to the world. For example, the celebration of Halloween, we should teach them to dress like saints and heroes in the Church and pray for the souls; instead of doing it in a pagan way dressing like witches and vampires; eating, drinking, and getting drunk. On Valentine's Day, instead of seeking the pleasure of the world, we should talk to them about the importance of selfless love of Christ through this Saint and so on...seeking to make more members of the body of Christ here on earth will bring more souls into heaven.
