

A STEWARDSHIP MOMENT In today's Gospel we hear of the rulers who sneered at Jesus, the soldiers who jeered at him, the criminal who reviled him, and the people who just stood by. At our own parish church, the cross stands high. Yet, every Sunday there are those who sit in front of it and are not moved by it. There are people who walk right by the cross, unmoved by it. Perhaps they've walked by it so many times they no longer give it a second thought. Could it be they are unmoved because the heart of this unbelieving thief is in them? Good stewards walk by the cross, notice it and ask themselves: "All this you did for me, what have I done for you?"

This Sunday's Gospel Thoughts for the Week November 20, 2022



1st Reading 2 Sm 5:1-3 Shepherd My People

"Your bone and your flesh": In a tribal setting, the king has a strict father image. Moreover, the Hebrews saw the king as a sign of God's kingship. He is God's vicegerent on earth. He leads the people as a shepherd tends his flock. He is anointed, hence called "Messiah," which means "anointed King." The New Testament writers applied theses characteristics to Jesus. Jesus is one with his body the Church (Second Reading). He is the good shepherd and the Messiah –anointed King.

The Responsorial Psalm was sung by the pilgrims, coming from all over the country, when full of excitement they entered the temple precincts. We apply it to the heavenly temple where Jesus as King sits at God's right hand.

Responsorial Psalm:

Let us go rejoicing to the house of the Lord.

2nd Reading Col 1:12-20 Primacy of Christ

Paul describes who Jesus, dying on the cross (Gospel), really is. He identifies Jesus with "Wisdom" in Proverbs 8:22-31. Jesus, as Son of God, is from God and absolutely prior to the visible universe. He is head of his boy the Church. He has reconciled us with God. We thank the Father that he has rescued us from darkness and brought us to the kingdom of his beloved Son.

Gospel Lk 23:35-43 The Crucifixion

Jesus is King. But his kingship is something different: Jesus is reigning from a cross. He promises the "good thief": Today you will be with me in Paradise." Apparent defeat is actual victory in the resurrection.

We Christians must learn to see through the paradox of the cross and suffering. Our final destiny is eternal happiness with Christ in Paradise.

The solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King Of The Universe, Lk. 23:35-43

"He saved others, let him save himself."
