The third Sunday of Advent is traditionally called Gaudete Sunday. Gaudete is the Latin word for rejoice, and this Sunday is the time for us to rejoice because Jesus came and died so that we may live forever with him! Gaudete Sunday marks the halfway point until Christ's birth at Christmas.

A STEWARDSHIP MOMENT From the loneliness of his prison cell John the Baptist asks of Jesus: "Are you the one who is to come, or should we look for another?" The weeks before Christmas offer much to be joyous about, celebrating with family and friends, the glitter of seasonal decorations, the excitement of gift giving and receiving. But in our midst, there are the lonely and neglected, the poor, the hospitalized, the wayward, the shut-ins. There are those who feel that they have no hope. To whom should they look? Discipleship in the Lord includes being good stewards of others. Are there those in our family, our neighborhood, our community to whom we can reach out to show them a sign of Christ's presence in their midst?

This Sunday's Gospel Thoughts for the Week December 11, 2022



1st Reading Is 35:1-6, 10 Here Is Your God

This beautiful poem is attributed to the socalled "Second Isaiah," a prophet who stayed with the Hebrews in Babylonian exile. This prophet saw the Babylonian rule about to be toppled by the mighty King Cyrus of Persia, who would free the captives and let them go home. This is a poem of joyful hope. "Say to those whose hearts are frightened: Be strong, fear not! Here is your God, he comes with **vindication.**" Christians apply this vision to the future brought about by Jesus, the Messiah, God's Anointed One. "Then will the eyes of the blind be opened." The Lord gives sight to the blind. This is our Christian theme of joyful hope: Our Lord, who comes to be a light to the world. The lights of Christmas symbolize this idea.

Responsorial Psalm:

Lord, come and save us.

2nd Reading Jas 5:7-10 The Lord's Coming Is at Hand

James reminds us not to be overly optimistic. The bright future of the Messianic era will not be fully realized on this side of the grave. **We must** be patient! "Make your hearts firm, because the coming of the Lord is at hand." The prophets should be our models. If you are suffering, this reading could be an inspiring starting point for a personal prayer to God!

Gospel Mt 11:2-11 Effects of the Lord's Coming

Matthew takes up the theme of the first Bible reading. "Jesus said to them in reply:'...the blind regain their sight.' " Jesus is the one-to-come who will give hope to those who suffer.

This "hope" can be finding a way out of trouble through the aid of a loving human being: it can be resignation and acceptance of the unavoidable, founded in faith in a future to come hereafter. Every Christmas, the Lord Jesus should open our eyes to the beauty of life, and its extension, the life to come.


Rejoice in the Lord Always!
