A STEWARDSHIP REFLECTION

The prophet Jeremiah minces no words in today's first reading: "Thus says the LORD: Cursed is the one who trusts in human beings ... whose heart turns away from the LORD." And the prophet's "beatitude" resembles that of Jesus' teaching in today's Gospel reading when he proclaims: "Blessed is the one who trusts in the LORD, whose hope is the LORD." Good stewards understand that what the world values is not consistent with Gospel values. They realize that God has placed in their midst all the gifts, charisms, and resources needed to bring Christ to a world desperately in need of his loving presence. But to exercise good stewardship over God's gifts takes a great deal of trust. How does our stewardship reflect our trust in the Lord? What did we do today to give others hope in Christ Jesus?



CANNOT MARRY IN THE CATHOLIC CHURCH DUE TO A PRIOR MARRIAGE?

Pope Francis streamlined the process to petition for a declaration of nullity to make the process shorter. He also eliminated the mandatory fee. If a person is able to prove in this process that their prior marital bond was invalid for some reason, then he or she can marry in the Catholic Church or validate a current civil marriage. <u>This Sunday's Gospel</u> <u>Thoughts for the Week</u> February 13, 2022



<u>1st Reading Jer 17:5-8</u> Trust in the Lord

Guided by God, the writer of this poem offers his ideas on lasting happiness, for which human beings are ever restlessly searching. His observation is: Unhappy is the person who trusts in humans alone. Comparing such a person with a shrub in the desert clearly expresses the reason why there can be no lasting happiness.

On the contrary, **Happy the person who trusts in the Lord!** Again, the comparison gives the reason. Such a person is like a fruitful tree planted beside water. The Responsorial Psalm continues that same idea of trust in the Lord.

Responsorial Psalm:

Blessed are they who hope in the Lord.

2nd Reading1 Cor 15:1-12, 16-20 Hope for Eternity

As already mentioned (see Theme) happiness implies hope for more to come. Paul deals with our restless desire for more that reaches even beyond the grave. "If for this life only we have hoped in Christ, we are the most pitiable people of all." Christianity is that philosophy of life which offers hope to our "restless heart till it rests in [God]" (St. Augustine).

<u>Gospel Lk 6:17, 20-26</u> The Beatitudes

(For Matthew's version of Jesus' sermon, see the Gospel of the 4th Sunday in Ordinary Time-A) We should see this sermon as a challenge to perfection directed to all who seriously search for happiness. "Blessed are you who are poor...Woe to you who are rich." It is true that the poor feel the insufficiency of the human condition, hence the need for God, more keenly than the rich do. Matthew's version speaks of the "poor in spirit," which refers to responsible stewardship. **If the have's are constantly** aware that they do not own anything, but that they are just God's stewards, and that having more means more responsibility (social justice, charity by sharing), then they too will receive their reward in heaven.

God's word to the wealthy Christian is: With your money and talent for management, are you actively involved in any program to make the poor help themselves? If there is none, start one! "More will be demanded of the person entrusted with more" (Lk 12:48).
