

Do You Want To Fast This Lent?

In the words of Pope Francis: Fast from hurting words and say kind words. Fast from sadness and be filled with gratitude. Fast from anger and be filled with patience. Fast from pessimism and be filled with hope. Fast from worries and have trust in God. Fast from complaints; contemplate simplicity. Fast from pressures and be prayerful. Fast from bitterness; fill your hearts with joy. Fast from selfishness and be compassionate. Fast from grudges and be reconciled. Fast from words; be silent and listen.



<u>This Sunday's Gospel</u> <u>Thoughts for the Week</u> March 6, 2022



1st Reading Dt 26:4-10 Confession of Faith

This reading is a "Eucharistic Confession," a confession of thanksgiving. It is taken from the ritual prescribed for the feast of the harvest thanksgiving. "My father was a wandering Aramean..." Jacob (Israel), perpetually seeking pasture for his flock, ended up in Egypt where his clan first enjoyed prosperity and later was enslaved. Notice that the Exodus from Egypt "with terrifying power, with signs and wonders," has for the Jews a meaning similar to what the death and resurrection of our Lord Jesus Christ means to us Christians. Both are mighty acts of God resulting in liberation. Both inspire a Confession of Faith in which these mighty acts are recited. "Say to the Lord, 'My refuge and fortress, my God in whom I trust".

Responsorial Psalm:

Be with me, Lord, when I am in trouble.

2nd Reading Rom 10:8-13 Creed of Christians

This reading contains a baptismal Confession: "If you confess with your mouth that Jesus is Lord,...you will be saved." Our Confession of Faith at baptism is now more elaborate, but the very core of it is that God has raised the Lord Jesus Christ from the dead and made him Lord. Pay special attention to your Profession of Faith during this worship service!

Gospel Lk 4:1-13 Practicing Our Creed

Luke uses this tradition about our Lord to describe the temptations of the early church. Notice the Confession: "One does not live on bread alone...You shall worship the Lord your God, and him alone shall you serve...You shall not put the Lord, your God, to the test." Jesus was tempted to give up his vocation, the Church is tempted time and again to be unfaithful to her original calling, and we as individuals are tempted as well. We should be a "confessing" Church. Others should know clearly what we stand for. Could the above Confession of Faith inspire you during the week to come?

My Dear Brothers and Sisters/ Parishioners / Cosojourners as Kula Catholic Community,


Mahatma Gandhi: "the earth can provide enough for every man's need, but not satisfy man's greed".
