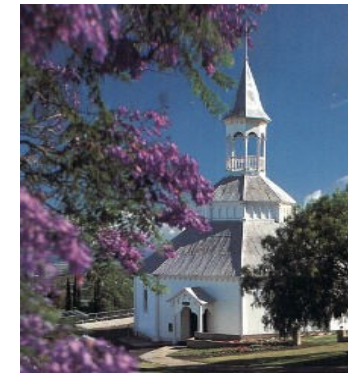

This Sunday's Gospel
Thoughts for the Week
April 10, 2022



1st Reading Is 50:4-7
Christ's Suffering

This reading is taken from the third song of the Servant of Yahweh. As mentioned at the feast of the Baptism of the Lord—A (p. 183), it is not clear whom the inspired writer had in mind when he composed these four songs describing the ideal Servant (Son) of God. Is he a collective person: Israel, God's people? Is he a king of the past or the Messiah (anointed king) to come?

In any case the Christian community applied these hymns very early to Jesus and they are used throughout Holy Week as a beautiful commentary on the passion narratives. Indeed, "the Son of Man [Jesus] did not come to be served but to serve and to give his life as a ransom for many" (Mt 20:28). Read the Responsorial Psalm meditatively, applying it to the Lord Jesus dying on the cross.

Responsorial Psalm:

My God, my God, why have you abandoned me?

2nd Reading Phil 2:6-11
Humility

This text is actually a Christ hymn, sung in church. It beautifully describes our Lord's utmost humiliation that he suffered on the cross. By being obedient, he made up for our sinful disobedience. But this hymn also sings of Christ's exaltation by the Father. Meditating on the Lord's suffering and death, as Christians do during Holy Week, we should keep both sides of the Christ event in mind. It is suffering and death that actually constitutes a passage to exaltation. Good Friday and Easter belong together even in our lives!

Gospel Lk 22:14-23:56 or 23:1-49
The Passion

Paul states: "For our sakes [God] made him [Jesus] to be sin who did not know sin, so that we might become the righteousness of God in him" (2Cor 5:21). Jesus identified himself entirely with sinful man, whom he freed from sin and death. Each of the evangelists relates the narrative with only a few different memories of the tragedy. In Matthew and Mark, Jesus' last words are: "My God, my God, why have you forsaken me?" (Mt 27:46; Mk15:34). Luke remembers that on the cross Jesus promised paradise to the criminal who repented and that Jesus said: "Father, into your hands I commend my Spirit" (Lk 23:46). All three relate the Lord's Supper, which Jesus gave us to celebrate as a memorial of his passion, death, and resurrection. **Prayer meditation on Jesus' passion should make us grateful for what Jesus did. He has said: "No one has greater love than this, to lay down one's life for one's friends. You are my friends" (Jn 15:13-14).**

A STEWARDSHIP REFLECTION

In the prelude to today's great Passion Narrative, Saint Paul reminds us that we find our hope in the "emptiness" and "humility" of Christ Jesus; a life that led to the cross, but through the cross, to glory and exaltation. The way is not easy. Good stewards know that it requires a willingness to lay aside all rights of personal privilege; emptying ourselves in the service of others; embracing values different from the values of the world. It requires an understanding that to be "in Christ" means to be a servant because Christ came into the world, not as Lord but as servant. What crosses are we willing to carry? What worldly values we are willing to forego in order to share Christ's glory?
