



This Sunday's Gospel Thoughts for the Week May 1, 2022



1st Reading Acts 5:27-32, 40b-41 Preaching the Name

The disciples had experienced the Lord Jesus as living after his crushing death on the cross. They shared their joy with others. His death was not a defeat but a victory. Indeed, he had a message for a better future. And since he was alive, his message of repentance and forgiveness of sins was still valid. The power structure of those days told the disciples to stop talking about this man, but, full of his Spirit, they could not comply.

Are we so convinced of Jesus and what he stands for that we share our experiences spontaneously through word and example?

Responsorial Psalm:

I will praise you, Lord, for you have rescued me.

2nd Reading Rev 5:11-14 The Throne of God

The writer uses the apocalyptic language of vision. He consoles Christians with our common faith that the Lord Jesus is alive and exalted with God. "Worthy is the Lamb that was slain...": Jesus is compared with the sacrificial lambs that were presented as sin offerings in the temple of Jerusalem. He is the Lamb of God who takes away the sins of the world.

"I heard every creature in heaven and on earth and under the earth"" this saying is conditioned by the Hebrews' understanding of the universe. For them, the earth is a plate, heaven is up, and down is "sheol," the netherworld, where the dead go. "The one who sits on the throne" is God. "The Lamb" is Jesus Christ. "The four living creatures" represent all of life: the lion, mobility; the bull, strength; the man, wisdom; the eagle, swiftness (see Rv 4:7).

God's word to us could be: Be consoled. Whatever your problems are, the Lord Jesus is alive and powerful. Turn to him in faith!

Gospel John 21:1-19 or 21:1-14 Christ is Lord

The tradition found in this reading brings out what the risen Lord meant to the disciples in the view of John who relates it, and at the same time what he means to us. The Lord is always with us, though often, like the disciples, we do not recognize him.

A meal is the symbol of togetherness. At the meal described by the author, Peter experienced the Lord's mercy. When we share the Eucharistic meal with our Lord, we should get to know and love him evermore.

My Dear Brothers and Sisters/ Parishioners / Cosojourners as Kula Catholic Community,

Nothing is impossible with the Lord, as nothing is possible without Him!

Peter and the rest headed towards a wrong direction that instead of fishing people; preaching them good news, they went to fish and caught nothing.
