The Living Rosary



<u>This Sunday's Gospel</u> <u>Thoughts for the Week</u> May 29, 2022



<u>1st Reading Acts 1:1-11</u> Christ's Ascension

The wording of this tradition on the ascension of our Lord is clearly conditioned by the limited understanding of the universe during the writer's lifetime. The wording is not part of divine revelation. There is no absolute up or down. Heaven is not a place somewhere up in outer space. Heaven is a situation outside our concepts of time and space. What the evangelists have tried to do is describe the final appearance of Jesus and/or the face that the Lord Jesus is "sitting at God's right hand," which is a Hebrew idiom for sharing power with God.

Luke's message is: Christ has died ("after he had suffered"), Christ is risen ("he presented himself alive to them"), Christ will come again ("this Jesus...will return"). That is the way we word it in our second Memorial Acclamation at Mass.

Responsorial Psalm:

God mounts his throne to shouts of joy: a blare of trumpets for the Lord.

2nd Reading Eph 1:17-23 Glorification of Jesus

Paul, a learned Jewish rabbi, relates the same message as Luke does in the First Reading and Gospel, only he does it in difficult theological language. Paul relates the risen and ascended Christ to all that exists. Christ is supreme above all creatures, seated at God's right hand (a Hebraism for "sharing power with God").

Paul prays for the Ephesians and for all of us: "May [God] give you a spirit of wisdom and revelation resulting in knowledge of him [the Lord Jesus]."

Gospel Luke 24:46-53 The Ascension

In comparing the way Matthew (A), Mark (B) and Luke (C) describe the last apparition of the Lord Jesus to his disciples, we see some differences. This should not shock us. The sacred authors took existing traditions at face value, and simply used them to proclaim their message which is that the Lord is alive, is with God, prays for us in heaven, and communicates his Spirit. This message is God's word to us, not all these details.

In the tradition used by Luke, Jesus stresses penance as part of the Christian message. Notice that the disciples returned to Jerusalem "with great joy." In witnessing for Christ, we should be full of joy as well, knowing that the Lord's Spirit dwells in us.
