


The Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ (Corpus Christi)

This Sunday's Gospel Thoughts for the Week June 19, 2022



1st Reading Gn 14:18-20 Blessing of Melchizedek

It is not clear why Melchizedek is called "a priest of God Most High." The Letter to the Hebrews (Ch. 7) refers to this passage and sees Melchizedek as a priest, foreshadowing Jesus Christ, because he blessed Abraham. Church tradition, as reflected in the first Eucharistic Prayer, refers to the bread and wine offered by this mysterious King Priest.

It may be that Melchizedek had offered the gifts of bread and wine previously to God and gave them to Abraham as a sacrificial repast together with his blessing. As such they could be types of the Eucharistic bread and wine, the Body and Blood of our Lord. "Look with favor on these offerings and accept them as once you accepted the gifts of your servant Abel, the sacrifice of Abraham, our father in faith, and the bread and wine offered by your priest Melchizedek" (Eucharistic Prayer 1). Relate the Responsorial Psalm to our High Priest, Jesus Christ!

Responsorial Psalm: You are a priest forever, in the line of Melchizedek.

2nd Reading 1 Cor 11:23-26 The First Eucharist

The early church celebrated the Eucharist as part of a communal meal, the "agape." Even today parish activities, picnics, and potluck dinners keep the members together and impart that feeling of belonging which we all need to persevere in the Christian way of life. However, in Corinth it had gotten out of hand. The rich brought their own food and did not share it with those who had less or nothing. Hence, the meal, which should result in a closer oneness of Christians, became a means of division.

Referring to this abuse, Paul invites the Christians of Corinth to meditate on the real meaning of the Eucharist. Are you aware that your partaking in the Eucharistic Banquet signifies not only your oneness wit the Host, Jesus Christ, but also your oneness with the guests at that banquet, your fellow parishioners?

Gospel Lk 9:11b-17 Loaves and Fishes

The way Luke relates this tradition is clearly colored by the Eucharistic Liturgy of his Churches: Jesus took the bread, looked up to heaven, pronounced a blessing, broke the bread, and gave it to his disciples. The narrative points into a clear direction: People are in the desert and they are hungry; Jesus feeds them through the apostles. It all foreshadows the Eucharist.

On our way through the desert of life, we are in need. The Lord is there with his care and love, feeding us with "the bread of life and the cup of eternal salvation" (Eucharistic Prayer 1).
