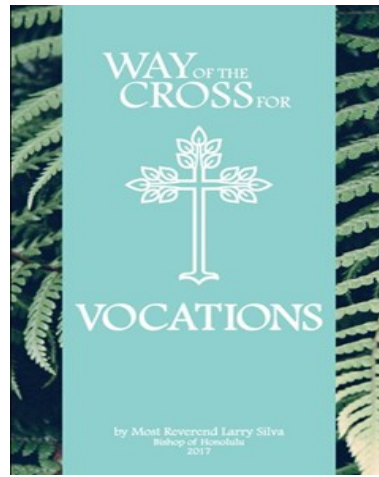

Thoughts for the Week

1st Reading Gn 18:1-10a
Hospitality

In this tradition, Abraham is introduced to us as an example of hospitality. He follows the rule of hospitality common to his time and culture. The point is that he was gracious. We should see Abraham's hospitality as related to his faith, which is rewarded by God. Sarah, and his wife, will have a son. "He who does justice will live in the presence of the Lord."

Responsorial Psalm:

He who does justice will live in the presence of the Lord.

2nd Reading Col 1:24-28
The Mystery of Christ

We should receive Christ with a mature faith. Paul had preached this mystery to the Colossians. But a mystery is something we should penetrate into ever more by faithful meditation. Just as we grow in understanding a loved one by daily conversation, so should we grow in understanding our Lord by meditatively listening to his words in Scripture and meeting him with an open mind in our fellow humans/guests.

Gospel Lk 10:38-42
Martha and Mary

Marth and Mary were hospitable toward our Lord—each in her own way. Martha was "burdened with much serving" in doing the household tasks. Mary listened to Jesus' words. Both aspects of hospitality are important. But openness to the guest as a person, in this case to our Lord's message of salvation, is more important.



When we receive Christ in other human beings, we should have an open eye for this mystery. Whenever I experience goodness, God is present!

Actions speak louder than words because it includes the art of listening.

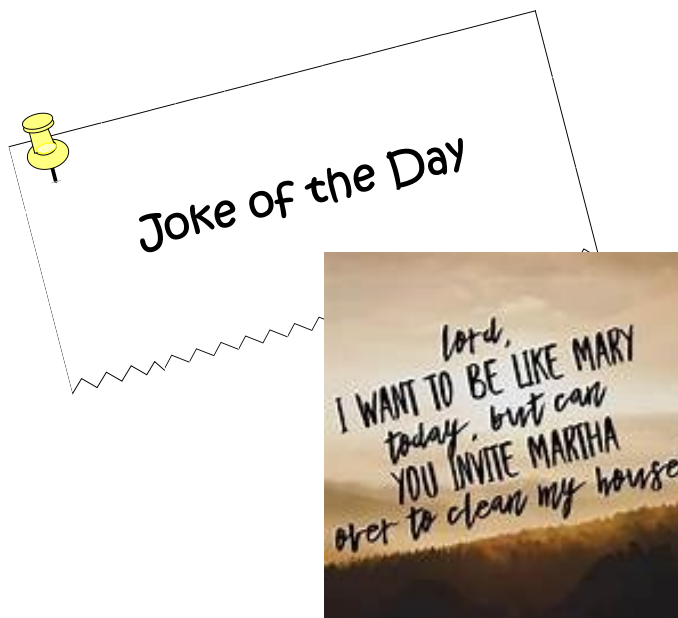
