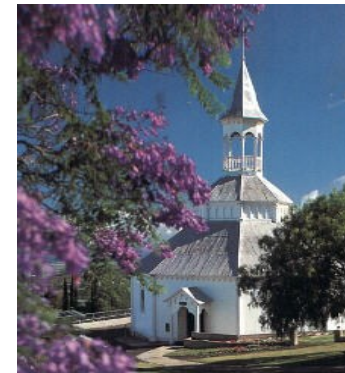

1st Reading Gn 18:20-32
Praying with Perseverance

By relating this tradition concerning Abraham, the sacred writer wants to teach us about the necessity of praying perseverance. Abraham even bargains with God and God listens. "Lord, on the day I called for help, you answered me".

But does the heavenly Father always grant exactly what we ask? The same psalm continues: "When I called you answered me; you built up strength within me." This may be the answer. God will hear our prayers and certainly give us the strength to handle any situation in life.

Responsorial Psalm:

Lord, on the day I called for help, you answered me.

2nd Reading Col 2: 12-14
New Life from God

Paul resists preachers who want to impose laws of the Old Testament on Christians. We are saved not by observing those laws (such as circumcision), but by God's grace given to us because of Jesus' death on the cross. We have a new life in company with Christ. Do we appreciate that company?

Gospel Lk 11: 1-13
The Lord's Prayer

Jesus taught us how to pray. We should address God as Father. We should pray with perseverance. But will we obtain exactly what we ask? Comparing God with our father here on earth, Jesus says, "How much more will the Father in heaven give the Holy Spirit to those who ask him." Remember, the Responsorial Psalm says: "You answered me; you built up strength within me."

God knows best what we really need! Perhaps we need "(his) spirit of wisdom and understanding, (his) spirit of counsel and of strength, (his) spirit of knowledge and of fear (filial respect) of the Lord" (Is 11:2). If we become filled with God's Spirit and can cope effectively with some difficult situation or obtain the insight to solve a problem the God has answered our prayer!

PASTOR'S CORNER

My Dear Brothers and Sisters/ Parishioners / Co-sojourners as Kula Catholic Community,
 "The hand of the Lord feeds us" from today's responsorial psalm.

The generosity of our God is manifested in this Sunday's scripture passages; in the first reading prophet Elisha orders his servant to feed a hundred people with just twenty barley loaves and still had left over. The gospel highlighted the powerful God, feeding the hungry crowd with five loaves and two fish. After eating, they still gathered twelve wicker baskets left over, which means they gathered more than they originally had before eating.

We need the miracle in our time as we face the scarcity of foods, water and oil especially in war-torn zones or countries. We need to be generous and not afraid that we might not have enough for ourselves. We must imitate the little boy, who did not hesitate to share the five loaves and two fish. I am very convinced that many of us have more than the little boy has. We need to share the grace of God we receive from Him so that it will be multiplied; for the more we give the more we will receive, Prov. 11:24-31. It is better to give than to receive, Lk. 6:38. **A special thanks to those who had generously always donate their time, talents and treasure for our community! More blessings to you all!**

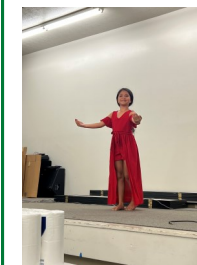

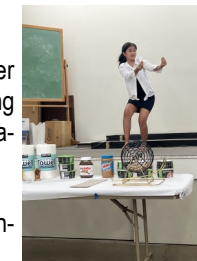
