This Sunday's Gospel Thoughts for the Week August 14th, 2022



1st Reading Jer 38:4-6, 8-10 Imprisonment of Jeremiah

Jeremiah the prophet ("spokesman of God") corrected the power structure of his society. Israel was God's chosen people living with him in a sacred partnership (covenant). He wanted those in power to realize this, but they did not like to be corrected by the man of God.

This reading prepares us to understand today's Gospel in which Jesus predicts his passion and death. Suffering and endurance is part of each serious Christian's life, and faith in God should help us to stand it. "Though I am afflicted and poor, yet the Lord thinks of me".

Responsorial Psalm:

Lord, come to my aid!

2nd Reading Hebrews 12:1-4 Perseverance

Wherever the ancient Romans built cities, one finds the ruins of an amphitheater. They loved the games. This passage uses sporting language to encourage us not to follow the easy way as Christians but rather to make even painful decisions, if necessary (Gospel). Life is the arena of the local amphitheater. A Cloud of witnesses/ spectators watches us. Sins are hindering clothes. Takes them off when you are running.

Keep your eyes fixed on Jesus. As a good coach, he inspires and perfects your faith and self-confidence. And he gives the reason for your efforts, namely, the joy of heaven. He himself endured the opposition of sinners (Gospel). The lesson for you and me is: Do not abandon the struggle!

Gospel Lk 12:49-53 A Divided Household

"There is a baptism with which I must be baptized." Jesus refers to "baptism by immersion." In other words, he says: "I will be immersed in pain and death." And he shows that he is human by feeling anguish!

Jesus could not conceive of himself as running a popularity contest. Those who follow him must be willing to make even painful decisions. "Avoiding the occasion of sin" could be such a decision!

PASTOR'S CORNER


My Dear Brothers and Sisters/ Parishioners / Cosojourners as Kula Catholic Community,

Outdoor Stations of the Cross- Our Lady Queen of Angels

Decree for the erection of a way of the cross at Our Lady Queen of Angels' Church, Keokea, Maui. In virtue of the faculty given to me, I, James J. Sweeney grant the authorization to build a way of the cross with the appropriate indulgences that come

with erection of a way of the cross in keeping with the statutes of sacred congregation of indulgences given to that congregation dated 10th May, 1742. As Testimony to the above I have affixed my signature to this document on the 3rd of May 1943. Signed by: James J. Sweeney, Bishop of Honolulu.

The document was translated from Latin to English by LaSalette Father Salvador Pico, M.S.

We judge this document was put in a "safe place", discovered by Father Adondee then translated by Father Salvador. Thanks to Father Anton's vision, the project has moved forward. He has done a remarkable job of single handedly building the crosses out of concrete and installing them along the edge of the property.

The committee has selected beautiful bronze artwork depicting each of the Stations. The goal is to raise \$20,000 to offset the cost of the stations and for general maintenance. For each contribution of \$500 or more, the donor's name will be affixed to a donor's plaque, if desired. But any amount would be greatly appreciated. We also intend to replace the large wooden cross. Upon examination it is

very weak. We are not certain whether it could withstand a serious storm.

On this year's Good Friday, we held our first outdoor stations. We intend to promote these outdoor stations island and state wide with the hope that pilgrims far and wide will take advantage of such a beautiful setting for the stations.
