A Stewardship Moment In the story of the Prodigal Son, from a stewardship point of view there is a secondary theme: the failure to use responsibly the gifts that have been so generously bestowed. The youngest son who demanded his inheritance and left home broke no laws or religious commandments. His wrongdoing was that he wasted his inherited wealth, the abundant gifts given to him. His sin was in his extravagant living, squandering his gifts in pursuit of selfish pleasures. Good stewards acknowledge that everything they have comes from God, and they are required to cultivate these gifts responsibly. What are our God-given gifts? Do we use them responsibly? Do we exercise good stewardship over them?

This Sunday's Gospel Thoughts for the Week **September 11, 2022**



1st Reading Ex 32:7-11, 13-14 The Plea of Moses

This reading shows us that because of Moses' intercession God agrees not to punish the sinful people. As mediator, Moses foreshadows Jesus Christ, who prayed on the cross for sinners: "Father, forgive them," and who is still praying for us in heaven (Heb 7:25). Because of Jesus' pleading for us, God will not destroy the sinner. The condition is that we make the Responsorial Psalm our constant prayer to God.

Responsorial Psalm:

I will rise and go to my Father.

2nd Reading 1 Tim 1:12-17 God's Mercy

Paul refers to himself as a former sinner (Acts 8:1-3). God forgave him because of Jesus' meritorious death on the cross. Paul is grateful for God's mercy, as all sinners should be.

Gospel Lk 15:1-32, or 15:1-10 The Prodigal Son

This passage is a perfect example of the fact that the writer of this Gospel did not intend to provide a biography of Jesus. What he intended to do was write a catechism, a digest of what Christians ought to know. However, Luke did not write a question-andanswer type of catechism that was used for the last few centuries in the Church and with which most of the older Catholics were taught their religion. He did it his way.

Luke makes a thought-provoking statement that he puts into the mouth of the Pharisees: "This man welcomes sinners and eats with them." Then he responds to it with three parables of Jesus: "the lost sheep" and "the lost coin" (concerning God's care for the sinner), and "the prodigal son" (concerning the condition for forgiveness: "I shall...go to my father," and God's willingness to forgive the penitent sin-

God's word to us today is clear. It is through Jesus Christ, his meritorious death on the cross and his constant pleading for us in heaven, that God forgives our sins. "I shall...go to my [heavenly] father"this is what the sinner should do, and God will show mercy. Jesus is still welcoming sinners!


